
Dinos Theme










Sensory: Dino World

Supplies needed:

- Sand

Process:

Art: Paint a Planet


Supplies needed:

- Dinosaur Cut out
- paint
- paint brush
- Canvas panel or water color paper

Process:

Lay the dinosaur cut out on top of the paper or canvas. Allow your child to paint over it.

Encourage them to paint all over the entire dinosaur and outside of it at as well. Remove the dinosaur and show they how it left the outline of a dinosaur!



Science: Make a Volcano

Supplies needed:

- lava colored paint
- baking soda
- jar or cup
- vinegar
- dish soap
- water

Process:

Talk to your child about how scientist believe there were a lot of volcanoes around during the time of the dinosaurs and ask them if they want to make one. Fill your cup about 1/3 of the way with water, a dash of soap, a teaspoon of paint, and a teaspoon of baking soda. Have your child add the vinegar and watch the magic happen!
